Day 1 Drivers for regulatory & market design changes

3. [Impact of New Technology & Market Design in 2030](#)

 - Enhancement to market designs to embrace technologies like smart grids, intermittency, storage systems and others.
 - What would a good 2030 market design look like?
 - Impact of new technology on market efficiency, competition and consumer behaviour.
